






























Entry Point – Learning about the Tudor Rose and visiting Eastbury Manor House

<u>Art</u> – We will be creating a portrait in the style of Holbein Activities:

- Visit the National Portrait Gallery
- Create family portraits
- · Recreate a portrait of a famous Royal

Key Vocabulary: scale, body proportion, refining technique, composition

Key questions: How do we create a portrait in the style of Holbein?

${\underline{\bf History-}} \ {\bf We will be completing a local history study focusing upon Barking and Dagenham during the Tudor times$

Activities:

- Visit the Barking Abbey ruins
- Visit Hampton Court Palace the home of Henry VIII

<u>Key Vocabulary:</u> Tudors, monarch, Reformation, monastery, dissolution, monarchy



Key questions: How did the Reformation change Barking and Dagenham?

<u>PSHE</u> – The theme of our PSHE lessons is 'Being me in my World'. We will be discussing our rights and responsibilities as a citizen and how we can be empathetic towards others.


Activities:

<u>Key Vocabulary:</u> empathy, rights, responsibility, citizen, refugee, conflict.

<u>Key questions:</u> What rights and responsibilities do I have as a member of my school and a citizen of my country?

<u>Science</u> – We are comparing and grouping everyday materials based on their properties. We will explore reversible and irreversible changes.

Activities:

- Look at items in your house and consider the materials they are made from?
- Can you change a material from a solid, liquid or gas into another state?

<u>Key Vocabulary:</u> atom, particle, dissolve, insoluble, soluble, solution, filter, evaporate, reversible, irreversible.

Key questions: What are the reversible and irreversible changes of solids, liquids and gases?



<u>PE</u> – For outdoor PE, we will learn a range of football skills. In indoor PE, we will be improving our fitness. Activities:

- Practise your football skills by dribbling a ball (or rolled up sock) around an obstacle course.
- Create your own fitness routine to your favourite song.

<u>**Key Vocabulary:**</u> travel, dribbling, defence, tackle, sequence, repetition, pattern.

Key questions:

What skills are needed to play football?

<u>RE</u> – We will look at what different people believe about God. Activities:

 Go for a walk and identify what different religious buildings are in your area.

<u>Key Vocabulary:</u> world religions, Humanism, agnostic, atheist, God, faith, belief

Key Questions:

What do world religions believe about God?

<u>Computing</u> – We will be developing our understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices

Activities:

 Research what London was like during the Tudor times and compare the results using a more / less refined search

Key Vocabulary: refine, search engine, system, World Wide Web

Key Questions:

How are searches influenced and the results ranked?
