What have we been learning?

Year 5

We have had a week of exciting science experiments, where we have learned how to separate mixtures using filtering, sieving and evaporation. In Maths, we are now confident at finding common multiples and factors of a number. Our Computing lessons have reminded us about the processes and outputs required to make systems work; we even designed our own digital teddy, considering the inputs and outputs necessary to perform a desired process.

We have also had fun in science. We looked at how the beaks of finches had adapted to suit their environment and investigated which beak type would be the most suitable to collect different foods. We used spoons, tweezers and pegs to simulate different beak types and tried collecting elastic bands, cubes, counters and seeds.

To finish off the week, we split into our houses to complete our first house challenge of the year- Black History Month. The children learned about influential black women and their contributions to the positive changes we currently experience.


