

Entry Point – A virtual trip to the historical Sutton Hoo site.

<u>History</u> – We will be exploring and creating a timeline of the events that took place after the Romans left Britain. We will learn how Britain was invaded and raided by the Scots, Anglo-Saxons and then the Vikings. **Activities:** - Create a timeline of your family history. How far back can you go? Find out about the discovery of the mysterious Anglo-Saxon ship at Sutton Hoo.


Research Viking runes and send a secret Viking message. Visit the British Museum.

Key Vocabulary: Picts, Scots, invade, raid, defend, Anglo-Saxons, settle, Vikings, Paganism, Christianity **Key questions:** Why did the Scots and Picts want to invade?

<u>RE</u> – We will look at how Christmas is celebrated around the world. **Activities**: Make a Christingle. Research and make a fact file about how other religions celebrate important festivals. **Key Vocabulary:** God, Jesus, Advent, Christingle, Christmas, traditions, Epiphany denomination congregation **Key Questions:** Why do we celebrate Christmas? Does everybody celebrate Christmas? How is it different or similar to how you celebrate?

<u>Music</u> – This half term, we will learn and perfect our ability to improvise when playing instruments. We will listen and appraise a range of Jazz and Swing-style songs, identifying their structure before learning to play the instrumental parts with music by ear. **Activities**: Identify instruments used in different styles of music. **Key Vocabulary:** Syncopation, improvise, pulse, rhythm, pitch, tempo, riff, hook, solo

Key Questions: How do you know this is Bossa Nova or Swing music?



PSHE –This half term we will be Celebrating Differences. We will look at behaviours that can be bullying, including racism. We will focus upon the value of respect. **Activities:** Design a friendship poster. Write an acrostic poem for the word RESPECT. **Key Vocabulary**: culture, conflict, racism, discrimination, homophobic, respect **Key Questions:** How do I manage my feelings in different situations? How can I help to solve problems? Why is it important to celebrate differences?

<u>PE</u> - We are developing our attacking and defending skills in basketball. In indoor PE, we will be focusing upon developing our artistic gymnastic skills.

Activities: Practise throwing and catching. Use two hands to bounce a ball on the spot and on the move. How long can you keep a balance? Key Vocabulary: attack, defend, control, pass, balance, pathway, mirror.

Key questions: Can I understand when to dribble and when to pass the ball? How can I link movements in a sequence? How can I improve my own performance?

<u>Geography</u> – We will be learning about the countries of Europe and considering how the countries are different. We will also be comparing Scandinavia with the UK.

Activities: - Find Scandinavia and the UK on Google Maps. What differences can you see? Take a virtual tour to some of the landmarks in the UK and Europe? Why not visit the Eiffel Tower in Paris or the Colosseum in Rome?

Key Vocabulary: continent, country, landlocked, borders, climate, landscapes, tundra

Key questions: Is every country in Europe the same? Which are the hottest and coldest cities in Europe at the moment? What are the similarities and differences between the UK and Scandinavia?
