Lunch and Snacks



- All nursery children are entitled to free milk every day.
- All children are given a piece of fruit daily.
- Please do not send any snacks into nursery.
- Please send your child into school with a water bottle everyday.

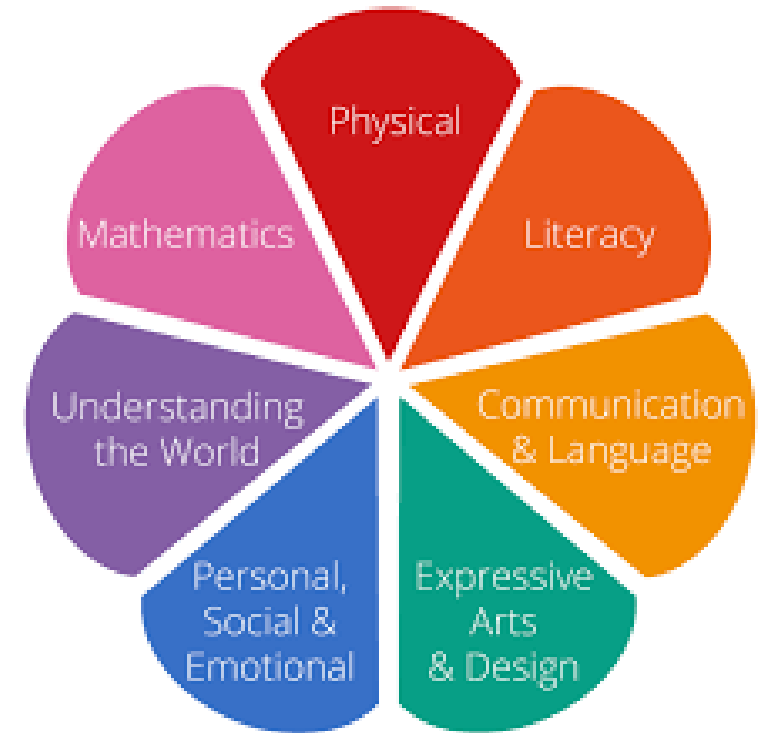
Children attending full-time:

- School dinners- through Parent Pay.
- If you choose to send in a packed lunch, it must be healthy and nut free. No chocolate, sweets or fizzy drinks.
- Lunchtime supervision cost- £3.00 per day (1 week free per half-term / Dinner cost- £2.41



EYFS Curriculum

- Follow Early Years Curriculum
- Learning through play and adult led activities
- Activities in the Nursery are planned to help the children to work towards the Age Related Expectations
- Focus on **3 Prime areas – Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development;**
- and the four Specific Areas: As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas – Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World, and Expressive Arts and Design





Preparing your child for Nursery

❖ **Communication- speaking and listening**

- Encourage children to talk about their new nursery, teachers and friends
- Developing speech sounds through talk
- New experiences- new vocabulary
- Sharing stories- builds imagination and vocabulary

❖ **Independence**

- Managing own toileting needs
- Taking off/putting on own coat
- Shoes- easy fastenings please!
- Using a knife and fork
- Taking care of things- having reasonable responsibility



Early reading- Little Wandle

A love of reading is the biggest indicator of future academic success!



- Teaching children to read and encouraging a love of reading is our highest priority at Parsloes
- Children learn to read through the **Little Wandle** phonics scheme
- Proud to be a Champion School!
- Reading journey begins in the Nursery year- sound discrimination, rhythm, rhyme, beginning to build phonological awareness
- Initial parent meeting and 'Look at My Learning' sessions



Early reading- Reading for pleasure

Read with your child every day and join the library:

- Encourage a love of reading and stories
- Develop their vocabulary, speaking and listening skills
- Sing nursery rhymes and other familiar songs
- Encourage your child to explore a variety of books and develop their own preferences
- Read in your home language as well as in English
- Children enjoy repeated readings of the same stories





Starting Nursery

- Children will follow an transition plan into nursery that is tailored to suit them
- Some children may follow a longer transition programme than others based on their needs- every child is an individual
