#### **Lunch and Snacks**




- Until their fifth birthday, Reception children are entitled to free milk every day.

#### **EYFS Curriculum**

- Follow Early Years Curriculum
- Activities and lessons are planned to help the children to work towards the Age Related Expectations
- Focus on 3 Prime areas –
   Communication and Language,
   Physical Development and Personal,
   Social and Emotional Development;
- and the four Specific Areas: As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas – Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World, and Expressive Arts and Design





## Preparing your child for Reception

#### Communication-speaking and listening

- Encourage children to talk about their new class, teachers and friends
- Developing speech sounds through talk
- New experiences- new vocabulary
- Sharing stories- builds imagination and vocabulary

#### \*Independence

- Managing own toileting needs
- Taking off/putting on own coat
- Shoes- easy fastenings please!
- Using a knife and fork
- Taking care of things- having reasonable responsibility

- Teaching children to read and encouraging a love of reading is our highest priority at Parsloes
- Children learn to read through the Little Wandle phonics scheme

## Early reading- Reading for pleasure

Read with your child every day and join the library:

- Encourage a love of reading and stories
- Develop their vocabulary, speaking and listening skills
- Sing nursery rhymes and other familiar songs
- Encourage your child to explore a variety of books and develop their own preferences
- Read in your home language as well as in English
- Children enjoy repeated readings of the same stories
